WHAT WE OFFER

One week of events, workshops, getting together with young people from different countries, learning about racism, anti-semitism and diversity, gaining experience and interesting new insights and above a lots of fun.

BASIC IDEA

400 young people from four countries will experience diversity by being together for one week; they will learn how to explore and reflect what diversity means to them; they will join a workshop on diversity on the first day after their arrival. After that, they will join workshops on different topics according to their fields of interest. Once they have chosen their workshop they will stay there for six timeslots for the whole week. The participants remain in a stable group, which gives them the opportunity to collaborate and have fun with peers from different cultural backgrounds. Every night they will reflect this experience in their family group and ask themselves what the take-away lesson of the day means for their personal development. At the end of the week, they will visualise their results of the different workshops in group presentations. And finally there will be a farewell party.

OUR MISSION

With this project, we would like to contribute to international understanding and peacemaking in the world and fighting against anti-semitism and racism. We are convinced that the personal experiences of young people through encounters with people from different backgrounds can make a significant difference.

PURPOSE

By experiencing, exploring and reflecting diversity, the participants will gain a new understanding of how diversity affects their lives in many aspects and on different levels. They are being guided by making this inner journey of discovery. They will share what they explore, whether it is challenging or easy. The purpose is that they can integrate a new, even more positive understanding of diversity by being aware that sometimes it needs some effort. They might feel enriched and maybe they will make new friends from different parts of the world, with different backgrounds.

OUR VALUES

SCORA is a diversity-friendly space. We support each other. We create a safe space for self-exploration. We empower our participants to be who they are. We want to contribute to a better future. We always take very good care of our guests.

To improve intercultural skills.






























To improve the skills in a field of interest (workshop).

SCORA-FAMILY

Every SCORA-family consists of eight young people from the four SCORA meet 2024 countries. They will be looked after by facilitators (adults from Baden-Württemberg that have been carefully selected and briefed). Each group will stay together throughout the week and every morning and evening they will get together to reflect the new experiences.

The aim of the family groups is to provide a base where the young people can talk about their feelings and their needs and where they can find support. The facilitators will also liaise with the accompanying persons.



WORKSHOP: REFLECT, RESPECT, REACT!

All participants will take part in this workshop, where we reflect racism and anti-semitism and the effects they have on the individual person and on society. In the workshop we will use information and strategies to find out about difficulties but also about the benefits of cooperation. The aim is to develop strategies for your everyday life and to strengthen your courage and motivation.



FREE AND EASY

For these time slots we will provide you with different guided leisure options such as going to the cinema, sightseeing, singing, playing games. There will always be something going on!



WORKSHOP PHASES

We will provide 20-25 different workshops from different fields of interest such as dancing, music, sports, creative writing, history, natural science, drama/acting, doing research in a museum lab, experiencing historical exhibitions, aspects of spirituality and many more. Every participant of the SCORA meet 2024 week gets to choose one workshop he/she is interested in.

The workshops will always be conducted by experienced moderators/instructors. In the course of the six sessions each workshop team is going to create “a product“, which will be presented on the last day of the SCORA meet 2024 week.

ART AS A WAY TO CONNECT

LET'S CREATE A COLLEGE OF YOUR INDIVIDUAL, COLOURFUL AND EXPRESSIVE PICTURES!

We want to experience the joy of painting – a way of expressing yourself, working with colours and symbols. At the end of the week we will have created a collective picture project. Creativity encourages the feeling of togetherness, creates openness and provides a space for new ways of connecting with yourself and with other people. Art may not serve a purpose but it certainly makes sense.



JUGGLING

JUGGLING AS AN EXPERIENCE OF EXCHANGE

Participants learn how to juggle with different materials. EVERYBODY can learn to juggle! You only need sports clothes and the willingness to learn. The fun with all the colours, the other jugglers and the gravitation of things automatically follows... We learn to juggle alone and together and to present ourselves alone and together – it's possible on EVERY level. At the end, we will create a fine "diversity show" and perform it for the other groups.

We will look at the diaries of a „normal German“ who was opposed to Hitler and his regime and ask questions such as: Where does resistance start? What made it possible to speak out against the Hitler regime, to become involved, to exchange views?

Do you want to know where you will be staying, how the week is financed or what you must do if you want to take part? We are very happy to provide all these important details on this page. ACCOMPANYING PERSONS

Each delegation of 100 young people from abroad is accompanied by a maximum of 10 adults of the sending country. So if you wish to send 20 young people, you can also bring 2 adults to accompany them.

We will offer additional events and activities for the accompanying persons.

REQUIREMENTS

- Age 16/17 at the time of the encounter week.
- Good command of the English language.
- Willingness to participate in all events including pre- and post-event videoconferences as well as participation in the programme during the entire week (later arrivals or earlier departures are not possible).
- Openness to diversity.
- Agreement that photos and film recordings may be made and used in the SCORA context for website and social media.

BENEFIT FOR THE SENDING COUNTRY

When back home, the young people will be able to share their experiences as ambassadors for issues such as intercultural understanding and diversity in their environments/organizations.

COSTS

The organizers cover the costs for the whole week. These include: Accommodation, meals, transport, events and activities, etc. Only the travel costs to and from Stuttgart incl. visa etc. have to be paid for by the sending countries.

FOOD

We will offer vegetarian food. If there are any other requirements, please let us know (kosher, gluten or lactose free etc.)

INSURANCE

We will take out health, accident and liability insurance for all participants and accompanying adults for the duration of their stay in Germany.

Stuttgart is the main city of the federal state Baden-Württemberg in the southwest of Germany. It has a population of 600.000 and it is well-known for its car industry (Mercedes and Porsche) as well as for its university. People here are very friendly and relaxed. 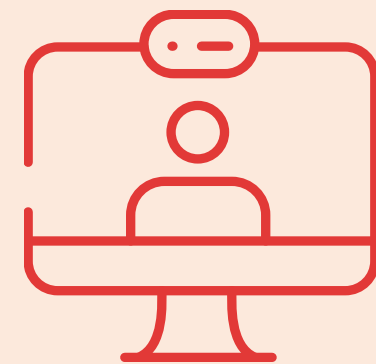

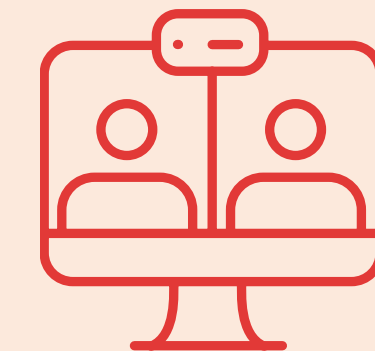
